Climate Change and Agriculture - the Basics

UK farms currently account for around 10% of UK GHG emissions. The different kinds of GHGs, how they impact on climate change and which agricultural practices contribute to emissions are introduced here.



Renewable Energy on Farm

Renewable energy generation on farm offers the opportunity to offset GHGs emitted as part of essential farming activity, and reduce energy costs or add an income stream.



Carbon Auditing - what is your farm's carbon footprint?

The first step to reducing your farm's carbon footprint is to understand what it is and where it comes from. There are various tools you can use to assess the carbon footprint of your farm business; details of four popular options can be found here.



Productivity and Efficiency










One crucial step in reducing emissions is to consider farm productivity and efficiency. If you can produce more whilst emitting less you could save costs as well as reducing the carbon footprint of the farm business.



Carbon Storage and Sequestration

Plants and soils on farmland store vast amounts of carbon and have the potential to store more, removing carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and combating climate change.
