Defra has now [opened the Sustainable Farming Incentive \(SFI\)](#) for applications in England.

The scheme is available to all farmers who currently receive Basic Payment Scheme (BPS) payments. It is designed to be accessible and will reward sustainable practices that support food production and benefit the environment.

The [SFI](#) is the first of three new environmental land management schemes being introduced under the Agricultural Transition Plan. The schemes will ensure long-term food security by investing in the foundations of food production: healthy soil, water, and biodiverse ecosystems.

What farmers can get paid for

The scheme will open with two soil standards and a moorland standard, where Defra will pay farmers to assess the condition of the moorland as a basis for further future action through our existing and new schemes.

In 2022, the three standards are the:

- arable and horticultural soils standard – with payments of £22 and £40 per hectare depending on what level is chosen
- improved grassland soils standard – with payments of £28 and £58 per hectare depending on what level is chosen
- moorland standard – paying £10.30 per hectare plus an additional payment of £265 per agreement.

This is the initial rollout of the scheme. It will be expanded over the next three years as Direct Payments are reduced. The full set of standards will be in place by 2025.

Eligibility and how to apply

The new application service is designed to be quicker and more straightforward for farmers. It includes some new functionality that allows Defra to automate the checks they need to do and process applications much more quickly than previously possible.

There is no 'application window' and no deadline by which farmers must apply, so farmers can apply throughout the year at a time that works best for them.

Defra will be rolling out the new functionality through July in a controlled and careful way, so they can make sure that they are able to offer everyone the right level of service and support during this initial phase.

That means that, while all BPS-eligible farmers can apply for the SFI, during the first few weeks of rollout there will be different ways into the service:

- Those in BPS only can apply directly now through the Rural Payments service
- Those in BPS with an existing Countryside Stewardship or Environmental Stewardship agreement, or farming commons, will be asked to contact the RPA, who will support them to apply.

Before farmers apply for SFI, there are some things they can do to prepare:

- Sign into the Rural Payments service to check their business and personal detail
- check that they and their land are eligible

Correction: the June survey of agriculture and horticulture for England

To reduce the survey burden on commercial farmers this year's agriculture and horticulture survey for England is a **sample survey** with approximately 30 thousand commercial holdings asked to complete the survey.

The survey opened at the beginning of June and the collection of the information is important and is mandatory under the Agricultural Statistics Act 1979. The 2022 survey gathers information on land use, crop areas, livestock numbers and farm labour.

If you are an active, commercial holding and have been selected to take part, you will have received an email or letter giving information on how to complete the survey. The easiest way to complete the survey is online at: <https://www.gov.uk/agricultural-survey>. A response is required even if you are no longer farming or are retired.

If you have already completed the survey, Defra would like to thank you for contributing. The information is important and is needed to agree industry priorities, to make the right decisions on investment, and to design policies which meet the needs of farmers. Similar information is collected by the appropriate authorities in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, allowing Defra to produce results for the UK as a whole.

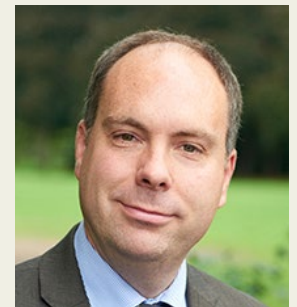
